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## Overview

St Remy de Provence luxury villa - Les Pierres Blanches is a newly-built, modern villa in an ancient setting, sitting in almost 750 acres of vineyards, one of the largest wine domaines in the region bordering the beautiful village of Les Baux de Provence in Les Alpilles.

## Description

St Remy de Provence luxury villa - Les Pierres Blanches is a newly-built, modern villa in an ancient setting, sitting in almost 750 acres of vineyards, one of the largest wine domaines in the region bordering the beautiful village of Les Baux de Provence in Les Alpilles.

It is tastefully decorated and furnished, and boasts beautiful views not only of the Alpilles mountains but also of the ruined castle which dominates the landscape surrounding Les Baux. The castle can be traced back to the 10th century. It was finally destroyed by the local people in 1632 to bring an end to the centuries of conflicts, revolts, sieges and wars of religion which had taken place there. Today, quaint artisan shops and restaurants line the tiny cobbled streets. A wider range of amenities can be found at Mausanne les Alpilles and at St-Remy-de-Provence, birthplace of Nostradamus, both of which are within easy reach of this Les Baux de Provence villa.

25 minutes drive north from this Les Baux de Provence villa is the medieval Papal city of Avignon, now a UNESCO World Heritage site and site of the world's biggest gothic palace. The city of Arles is just to the south with an impressive Roman arena, once holding 20,000 spectators. This is the gateway to the wetlands of the Camargue with its diverse wildlife ranging from pink flamingos to white horses and black fighting bulls.

Split level ground floor:  
Hall leading to:  
Study, open fireplace, large arched doors onto pergola terrace.  
Spacious living room, open fireplace, large arched doors onto garden with magnificent views across the estate to the historic ruins of Les Baux de Provence. Dining room. Large kitchen/dining room, door to pergola-covered terrace for outdoor dining.  
Steps up to master bedroom suite (1.60m), large arched doors onto garden with views of Les Baux, ensuite bathroom with walk-in shower, WC.  
Steps down from hall to TV room (TV,DVD,video,CD) doors to front garden.  
Guest WC.  
Twin/double bedroom (2 x 0.90m or 1.80m), ensuite bathroom, doors to garden.  
2 x twin/double bedrooms (2 x 0.90m or 1.80m), each with doors to garden & ensuite shower rooms.  
Second guest WC.

First floor:  
Double bedroom (1.60m), ensuite shower room.  
Separate WC.  
Twin/double bedroom (2 x 0.80m or 1.60m), bathroom, balcony window and doors to roof terrace.

## More Info

Outside:  
Set in 750 acres of working vineyards with views of the Alpilles and the ruins of Les Baux de Provence. Large areas of gently sloping lawn (drops beyond). 12m x 5.5m salt-water swimming pool set away from the house with a pergola for shade. Pergola-covered dining terrace, barbecue. Boules pitch. Ample parking.

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## Location

Les Baux-de-Provence 1.25 miles. Mausanne les Alpilles 2 miles. St-Remy-de-Provence 4 miles. Arles 11 miles. Avignon (TGV) 19 miles. Nimes airport 40 mins. Marseille airport 50 mins. Golf, walking, cycling, horse riding nearby. You could visit the unspoilt, ancient hilltop village of Les Baux de Provence only a few minutes away (FYI the mineral bauxite used in the production of aluminium, takes its name from the village). After some sightseeing maybe you would like a culinary experience at the 1 star Michelin restaurant “La Cabre d’Or” located on the route d’Arles just outside the village, or of similar calibre l’Oustce de Beaumaniere Menu +90€. For a simpler lunch or dinner try the brasserie Les Quentades in the village - they have a fabulous terrace for eating al fresco.
